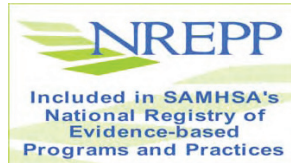


TeenScreen Schools and Communities

Evidence-Based Ratings

National Registry of Evidence-based Programs and Practices (NREPP)



In 2007, TeenScreen was added to the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration's (SAMHSA) National Registry of Evidence-based Programs and Practices (NREPP). SAMHSA is a program of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services.

NREPP is a searchable online registry of mental health and substance abuse interventions that have been reviewed and rated by independent reviewers. The purpose of the federal registry is to assist the public in identifying approaches to preventing and treating mental and/or substance use disorders that have been scientifically tested and that can be readily disseminated to the field. Each intervention/ program listed in the registry includes descriptive information about the intervention/ program and its targeted outcomes, as well as Quality of Research and Readiness for Dissemination ratings. TeenScreen was among the first suicide prevention programs to be included in the NREPP registry and received one of the highest overall ratings for Readiness for Dissemination in its category.

Best Practices Registry For Suicide Prevention



The Best Practices Registry For Suicide Prevention is a collaboration between the Suicide Prevention Resource Center (SPRC) and the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention (AFSP). The registry is funded by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA). This joint effort aims to identify and classify effective suicide prevention programs through a structured, multi-disciplinary review process. TeenScreen is listed in Section I of the Registry which identifies interventions that have undergone rigorous evaluation and demonstrated positive outcomes.
